A Note from the Pastor

That all Church power, whether exercised by the body in general or in the way of representation by delegated authority, is only ministerial and declarative; that is to say, that the Holy Scriptures are the only rule of faith and manners; that no Church judicatory ought to pretend to make laws to bind the conscience in virtue of their own authority; and that all their decisions should be founded upon the revealed will of God. Now though it will easily be admitted that all synods and councils may err, through the frailty inseparable from humanity, yet there is much greater danger from the usurped claim of making laws than from the right of judging upon laws already made, and common to all who profess the gospel, although this right, as necessity requires in the present state, be lodged with fallible men. (Book of Order, F-3.0107)

Scripture is our highest authority, and governing bodies within the church always begin with scripture. Declarative power is limited to that of stating what biblical teachings are in a particular situation or context. Thus the church, after long study of scripture, reliance upon the Holy Spirit and prayer, has changed its views of issues (such as slavery and the status of women) based upon its interpretation of scripture in these particular circumstances.

When a properly constituted governing body of the church makes a decision, great care must be taken by those who find it troubling. There is trust that the best discernment of the guiding of the Spirit happens in the assembly of God's people, gathered for prayer, conversation and decision making. Because our system works slowly and carefully, and provides every opportunity for diverse voices to be heard, the possibility of rash decisions is lessened.

There is no guarantee that we always make decisions in line with the will of God. Each assembly at every level of the church brings in the contexts, cultures and biases of those who are part of the process. Those who believe decisions have been made in error have rights and duties, and can seek change through the system and process of the church. The church's history is filled with decisions that have been retracted, modified or discarded because there is new understandings and contexts to consider. At the end of the day, we trust that God is in charge and the Holy Spirit is working through the church.
